

LETTER FROM REVD LOUISE

Dear Friends,

the year seems to be going very quickly: it's April already!

This month we observe the most solemn and significant times in the church year: Holy Week, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. In our private prayers and in many services at church, we will be walking with Jesus once more from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through the conflicts and intensity of Holy Week, the sadness of the cross and the unbelievable joy of the resurrection morning. It's almost too much! We know how the story goes and it's often overwhelming: no wonder the disciples struggled to understand what was going on.

I do encourage all of us, whether we normally attend church, or not, to come and share in worship this year.

Our world seems so sad and bleak at present. So many lives seem empty, lost and broken. We can bring all of that in prayer to the cross, to Jesus who has carried the pain and sin of our world. He knows and shares our sadness. We can bring our sadness and anxiety to the God of life who transforms our fear of death, our guilt, our insecurity and confusion and offers hope and new life. This is the heart of the Christian message. That in Jesus, God has come to share our life, share in our death and now shares *his* life with us. He offers love to this angry and sad world. Have you accepted his offer of love? Will you, in turn, offer the news of his love, to those around you? Then, come to church and be strengthened and renewed in your faith in him. Details of service times are listed in the Magazine.

The week after Easter, on April 27th, we have our Annual Parish Church Meeting. This will be after a joint 10am service of Holy Communion at St Andrew's. The meeting will be in the church hall. The meeting is open to all to attend. If you wish to stand for the Parochial Church Council or as Church Warden, you must be on our Electoral Roll and be a regular communicant. There is more information about this elsewhere in the Magazine but do get in touch if you would like to know more.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Denise Askew for her service as Church Warden. She offers such help and encouragement. Parishes should have two Wardens and it is disappointing that she is having to soldier on alone. Do prayerfully consider if you could share in the work. There are, of course, many who work so hard for our churches. And I am immensely grateful to each one of you for the difference you make. God gives his gifts to the church and invites us to use them for the benefit of others. Please consider how you can be more involved in the life of our parish.

A big thank you, too, for those who support the work of our churches by your financial giving. Some can give a little and some can give a lot and we are grateful for all you give. As the new tax year begins, please review your giving. If you are a tax payer and don't yet give through the Parish Giving Scheme, it would be brilliant if you could transfer to this so we can reclaim the tax. You can do this anonymously and change your payments should your circumstances change (see pg. 24 for details of how you can give). If your income has increased in the past few years and your giving has remained the same, perhaps this may be a moment to increase what you give. Conversely, if your income has gone down, you may need to reduce your giving.

Serving and giving are all part of the worship we offer to God and we give thanks for all who share in this.

With my love and prayers as we continue through Lent to the joy of the resurrection,

You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand. (Psalm 16.11)

Parochial Church Council. We also elect PCC members at the meeting. These are trustees for the church and have oversight of all areas of church life: safeguarding, mission, finances, buildings etc. We meet 6-10 times each year, mostly on Zoom. If you have been confirmed and attend church regularly, we invite you to consider serving on the PCC. Again, please get in touch if you would like more information.

We must complete a revision of the Roll this year.



- or live outside the parish and attend church, or would do if you were not prevented from doing so by ill health, infirmity etc.

Those who have been at church over the past few weeks will have had chance to sign up again. There is still time to be included in the Roll for this coming year. Pick up an application form in either church. These may be returned to either church or dropped through Louise's door, 42 Church Road, Ss3 9EU.

Part of the Diocesan assessment for our Parish Share is based on the size of our Electoral Roll so it is important that it accurately reflects our church community.



LOVING GOD AND OUR NEIGHBOURS IN SOUTH SHOEBURY

1st April – All Fools' Day

In years gone by, the rules surrounding April Fool were this: between midnight and noon on 1st April, everyone is 'fair game' to be made a fool of. It is the morning of the practical joke. But the aim is not just to discomfort the victim: he must be tricked into taking action himself, sent on a 'fool's errand'.

And so, children would be sent to the dairy for a pint of dove's milk, or to the bookseller for *The Life of Eve's Mother*. Practical jokes on a bigger scale were played: in 1860 a vast number of people received an official looking invitation to the Tower of London that read: 'Admit the Bearer and Friends to view the Annual Ceremony of Washing the White Lions.' Precisely the same trick had been played in 1698.

Then, on the stroke of noon, tradition decrees, April Fools is finished. If anyone attempts devilry thereafter, even while the clock is still striking, it recoils on his own head. A child would then race through the sing-song formula: 'April-Fool-Day's-past-and-gone-you're-the-fool-and-l-am-none!'

17th April – MAUNDY THURSDAY time to wash feet

Maundy Thursday is famous for two things. The first is one of the final acts that Jesus did before His death: the washing of His own disciples' feet (see John 13). Jesus washed His disciples' feet for a purpose: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." His disciples were to love through service, not domination, of one another.

In Latin, the opening phrase of this sentence is 'mandatum novum do vobis'. The word 'mundy' is thus a corruption of the Latin 'mandatum' (or command). The ceremony of the 'washing of the feet' of members of the congregation came to be an important part of the liturgy (regular worship) of the medieval church, symbolising the humility of the clergy, in obedience to the example of Christ.

But Thursday was also important because it was on that night that Jesus first introduced the Lord's Supper, or what we nowadays call Holy Communion.

Jesus and His close friends had met in a secret upper room to share the Passover meal together – for the last time. And there Jesus transformed the Passover into the Lord's Supper, saying, 'this is my body' and 'this is my blood' as He, the Lamb of God, prepared to die for the sins of the whole world. John's gospel makes it clear that the Last Supper took place the evening BEFORE the regular Passover meal, and that later Jesus died at the same time that the Passover lambs were killed.

26th April – Mark

Mark, whose home in Jerusalem became a place of rest for Jesus and His 12 apostles, is considered the traditional author of the second gospel. He is also usually identified as the young man, described in Mark 14:51, who followed Christ after his arrest and then escaped capture by leaving his clothes behind.

Papias, in 130, said that in later years Mark became Peter's interpreter. If so, then this close friendship would have been how Mark gathered so much information about Jesus' life. Peter referred to him affectionately as his 'son'.

Mark was also a companion to Paul on his journeys. When Paul was held captive at Rome, Mark was with him, helping him. Mark's Gospel, most likely written in Italy, perhaps in Rome, is the earliest account we have of the life of Jesus. Mark died about 74 AD.

Early in the 9th century Mark's body was brought to Venice, whose patron he became, and there it has remained to this day. The symbol of Mark as an evangelist is the lion, and is much in evidence in Venice.
