


Pram Service at St Peter's



LETTER FROM REV'D LOUISE

Dear Friends,

I hope it's not too late for me to wish you a very blessed 2026! I'd also like to thank you so much for the many cards and gifts which you so kindly gave me for Christmas. And finally, to thank you for your hard work over Christmas with all the services, the refreshments, the decorating of the churches, the welcome you offered visitors and the excellent teamwork all round!

Some of you may have started worshipping at St Andrew's or St Peter's since Christmas and we extend a very special welcome to you.

St Andrew's and St Peter's are sister churches, which means that we work together and are really very similar. So, if you oversleep, don't give up on church for the day, maybe come to a later service?! You will be made very welcome whichever church you attend.

For the next few weeks, St Andrew's services will all take place in the church hall as we have the builders in working on the long-awaited new heating etc. I enjoy leading worship in the hall... it's a bit like being on a camping holiday. It's not the same but we sit next to different people, see things in a slightly different light and, to be honest, it's a great deal warmer than in the church.

As a church community, as well as drinking lots of cups of tea, we have a great many services, times when we join together in worship of God. But what is worship? The word 'worship' means 'worth ship'. It's about respect, giving due honour. So, when we *worship* God, we are responding to him as he is; we are giving him his worth. We sing and speak about how special he is to us. We offer all that we are and have, in response to his love and kindness. Worship can take many forms: there's no right or wrong way. It can be quiet and reflective, loud and exuberant. Worship can include music, but it doesn't have to. It can use lots of words, or just a few. It can include elaborate ritual or be very simple. In worship we use our bodies: we sit, stand, kneel, clap, raise our hands, make the sign of the cross, put our hands out to receive Holy Communion. We listen, we look, we feel in our hearts and we notice and appreciate the presence of God, by his Spirit.

A number of you recently have commented on how calm you find our services. I don't think you mean they are boring! Rather, you find peace in worship. In our services we try to give God's Spirit time to draw close to us. We don't rush through services: we say the words carefully and have chance to think about them. And when we are using service books, we try not to start until everyone has found the right page! Worship of God gives us space to be close to God and, perhaps to find a moment to catch up with ourselves. We notice how we are feeling and I encourage you to then turn those feelings towards God in your prayers. Come as you are and let God love you.

In worship we don't just do our own thing. We belong to each other, and our offering is a shared response to God. So, our attitude towards each other also matters. If we believe God loves all of us, we can't ignore or disrespect one another.

After we have drawn close to God in worship and received his peace, forgiveness and comfort and maybe stayed for a cup of tea to get to know each other better, we leave our church building to serve God in the week to come. I hope very much that our shared worship gives us encouragement for the week ahead, food for the journey.

If you are reading this and you have lapsed from attending church, why not come back? We won't moan at you for having gone missing: we'll just be pleased to see you. And, if you've never been to church, why not give it a try? It won't hurt and you might like it: you could even bring a friend!

¹⁵ Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise – the fruit of lips that openly profess his name. ¹⁶ And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

(Hebrews 13.15-16)

We live in troubling times, and many are finding God for the first time. They recognise that only God can give us his peace and hope in difficult days. May you find peace, healing and love in God,

Dear Friends,

Who do you share your shoes with? Do you wear them one day and someone else wears them next? Or do you take turns morning and afternoon?

We delivered your gift-filled boxes to one family in Kosovo and discovered the boys took turns at wearing their one pair of shoes. The one who didn't have shoes was barefoot. He was glad to find socks in his box. The toddler in the family had nothing from the waist down. New underpants in the shoebox were put to good use very quickly.

Another family had a foam mattress blocking the space where an outside door should be. It kept some cold out, but it didn't stop rats coming in. Dad was in prison and mum had no money for Christmas presents. Imagine how much your gifts meant to them!

The poverty of others is less obvious. Some young people were brought by their parents to a centre for people with disabilities to receive the boxes you had sent. It was so good to see them leave with smiles on their faces.

Thank you for all you have done to help us with our shoebox appeal. In eight countries across southeast Europe, people who are poor and disadvantaged in other ways were thankful to receive a box. We could have given away more. There are never enough but our partners know their communities and make sure your boxes go to the people most in need. They couldn't do it without your contribution.

The people who give out shoeboxes asked us to thank you. And we know that the children and adults who received a box all for themselves want us to thank you, too. You made them so happy!


GRADUATION

BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE

As of Jan 17th, the work in St Andrew's is progressing well with the builders working hard in very chilly conditions.

The font will be moved next week from its current position in the tower, to the front of the church. A new concrete base has been laid to bear its weight. Towards the end of the work, the new, suspended floor will be laid around it. Meanwhile, the encapsulated asbestos is being removed: this had been positioned under the pews to prevent damage from the heating elements. The new heating will be a combination of radiant heaters in the chancel and tower, and under pew, directional heat.

The pews will all be sanded and treated to give them many more years of life.

14th February - Aspects of Romantic Love

God obviously approves of romance – after all, putting Adam and Eve alone together in the Garden of Eden was His idea.

The history of the Israelites began with three great romances: Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, and Jacob and Rachel. The on-going history of Israel was deeply affected by later romances: Esther and King Xerxes, David's love affair with Bathsheba, and Solomon's marriage to hundreds of foreign wives. There is even an entire book in the Old Testament devoted to the love of a man and woman: the Song of Solomon!

When we reach the New Testament, we find real love between Joseph and Mary (even when Joseph thought Mary had been faithless, he did not want to harm her). St Paul, though himself a bachelor, nevertheless spent a lot of time urging Christians to love and be kind and faithful and considerate to their spouses. He even wrote 1 Corinthians 13 – the great love chapter that is read at millions of weddings worldwide 2000 years later.

Down the centuries ever since, romantic love has been critical in shaping history (Anthony and Cleopatra), in shaping cultural ideals (King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table). Some of our favourite stories are built on romance. (Puccini's *Tosca*, Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet*, Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice*, Charlotte Bronte's *Jane Eyre*.)

People make amazing sacrifices for love. They defy their family, forsake their culture, and turn their back on wealth and position, just to be with their loved one. (King Edward VIII and Mrs Simpson.)

People give their loved ones amazing gifts. The most extravagant is probably the gift of the Shah Jahan, who built the Taj Mahal in India for his favourite wife, Mumtaz Mahal.

Today, romance is still alive and well in Britain – last year we sent about 25 million Valentines to each other.

And what of the future? Well, just as the Bible begins with a love story, so it ends with one. And *you are involved!* For actually the greatest Love Story of all time is that between God and his people.

Christ is described in Revelation as our heavenly Bridegroom, and the Church is His beloved Bride. He has given us the most expensive present of all – Himself. And, just as in all the best romances, the story will end with the bride and groom getting together at last, so at the End of Time, Christ will return for His Bride.

Southend Foodbank Update for February 2026

The foodbank provides emergency food & practical support to people in their hardest moments. How can *WE* help?

1. Thank you to everyone who places items in the Foodbank collection boxes at both St Andrew's and St Peter's. In addition, you can make food donations at Shoeburyness & Thorpe Bay Baptist Church in Thorpedene Gardens every Thursday 12.30pm - 2.30pm. There is also a box for food donations just past the tills as ASDA. Please don't give perishable goods, such as fresh fruit and veg.
2. Each week the team publishes a list of the most urgent needs - although some items often appear week after week. Here's a list of what the Foodbank is currently running low on:
 - Tinned sweetcorn
 - Tinned tomatoes
 - Instant mashed potato
 - Pasta sauce
 - Tinned mince and onions
3. For anyone with a smartphone, there is an app called "Bank the Food". Once downloaded, add Southend Foodbank where prompted and they will update you weekly on the latest urgent needs (but there is no pressure at all to give).
4. Sadly, the Foodbank is having to close four of its church-based Distribution Centres from the end of January 2026 in order to live within available funds. However, the need for the Foodbank's work is as heavy as ever. So, let's keep supporting it with our donations. Christians from Shoebury churches (including ours!) generously serve as Foodbank volunteers. Let's keep all those involved in our prayers.

Fearfully and Wonderfully Made – God in the Sciences

Every person who ever lived was once a sperm and an egg. Those two cells fused together, and in nine months they turned into a living, breathing, human being. Each of us emerged from this same embryonic development process, which is highly complex and organised, but variable enough to turn out a unique individual every time.

If you like order – such as neat piles of stationery, or tidy colour-coded files – you will enjoy this story. One of the most important stages of an embryo's development is when each section of the body, from head to rump, takes on its identity. Each part is told what shape to take, and which limbs or internal organs to grow: legs or arms, lungs or kidneys, and so on.

The most beautiful part of this body-patterning process is that it brings the dimensions of time and space together in such a neat way. The DNA instructions for the procedure, known as genes, are organised in the order in which they are needed during development *which is also* the order in which they appear on the body. No other sets of genes are known to be arranged in such a tidy pattern.

So, as the embryo develops, the tissues near the head end activate the first sets of genes. Those active genes then make all the proteins needed for that part of the body to grow and develop in the right way. The tissues just below the head then switch on the second set of genes, and so on. A wave of activation passes down the embryo, specifying each section of the trunk in turn.

The Wisconsin-based developmental biologist Jeff Hardin often quotes Psalm 139 to express the wonder of embryonic development. The Psalmist did not understand how this process happened, but he knew that it was a marvellous thing. *“For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother’s womb...your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.”*

The story of the tidy genes brings out the hidden beauty in the very early stages of embryonic development. The more biologists get to find out about how we came to be born, the more we can say, “*I am fearfully and wonderfully made*”!

GIVING

We are very grateful to all who give financially to the work of our parish. Although we don't physically take the collection plate around during services, it is fantastic that so many of you are so generous week by week in placing money in the collection plate. This is a cost we gladly share across the churches, but I wonder if our parents whose children attend the after-school groups, might consider making a regular contribution to the church? We don't charge subs as we want all our activities to be free at the point of delivery but, please give it some thought.

Also, since Patrick has stepped down as our Treasurer and no one has been able to take this task on, we have now agreed that another Mark, **Mark Cardnell**, will help us with our accounts. This is his occupation so we will need to pay his monthly fee.

Please be assured that our church finances are sound and we are thankful that God has provided for us so faithfully over so many years. The various building works are being funded from legacy money and we believe this is a great investment for the years to come.




