



LETTER FROM REVD LOUISE

Dear Friends,

I would like to thank you so much for the extraordinarily generous amount of harvest gifts which you brought to church this year. The gifts were shared between the Food Bank and HARP and it's good to know we can help those in our city who are having hard times. Thank you too, for the £222 raised at the Harvest Supper for the Southend churches winter night shelter. Your donations for the annual shoebox appeal continue to come in: our boxes this year will be taken to Kosovo to help people in need. On December 7th we invite you to come to church with a gift for someone who has no decent home. Please don't wrap the gifts. You can bring them to any of our regular services or leave them in St Andrew's which is left open during the day. Thank you so much!

At our Harvest Festival this year, we also took time at St Peter's to give thanks and celebrate Andy Clipsham's long ministry here as our Lay Reader, organist, and friend. We gave him a card that many of us had signed and presented him with a gift from the parish. Andy has worked so hard and shared his gifts of preaching, worship leading, music and wisdom with us. Sadly, his health is making it hard for him to serve as he would like to. So, Andy is now officially retired from his licensed lay ministry but will play and read etc as often as he feels able to. He is now described as our 'Reader Emeritus'. In this way we acknowledge and affirm all he has been and always will be, to us, but it removes any pressure he feels to preach and play. Thank you, Andy and God bless, you!

We send our warmest congratulations to Lisa Thomas who recently received her certificate in Spiritual Companionship at Chelmsford Cathedral. Lisa has attended a series of modules on different aspects of the spiritual life.

Finally, I am delighted to welcome Mark Gadsden who will be helping us with our children's after-school clubs on Tuesdays. Mark works for most of the week at Shoebury and Thorpe Bay Baptist Church with their children and families. He has a huge amount of experience working with children and young people. He has been with us for a few weeks already and is a real joy to have around.

I've recently returned from a most interesting holiday in North Macedonia and Albania. It was organised by a Christian Pilgrimage company and included daily worship and visits to loads of amazing orthodox churches, beautifully decorated inside and out. This was especially moving in Albania as so many churches were destroyed during the dictatorship of Enver Hoxha (died 1985). We also visited some Catholic churches, and also a building built on the birthplace of Mother Teresa of Calcutta. This was in Skopje, the capital of North Macedonia. Whilst we were looking at various items of memorabilia, I was very taken by a notebook on which Teresa had written some beautiful words.


PILGRIM GROUP

Wonder and Worship

"I was travelling, and out early in the morning: at first there was a vast fog; but, by the time that I was seven or eight miles from home towards the coast, the sun broke out into a delicate warm day. We were then on a large heath or common, and I could discern, as the mist began to break away, great numbers of swallows (*hirundines rusticae*) clustering on the stinted shrubs and bushes, as if they had roosted there all night. As soon as the air became clear and pleasant they all were on the wing at once; and, by a placid and easy flight, proceeded on southward towards the sea".

How many church leaders today have time to enjoy their surroundings? Gilbert White was a vicar who became famous for his observations about the flora and fauna of his parish. His letters about the local wildlife through the seasons were so beautifully written that they are still in print today, more than 200 years after they were first published as *The Natural History and Antiquities of Selbourne*.

White is a great example of someone who saw science and faith in harmony. He writes that he hopes his readers will be inspired to "pay a more ready attention to the wonders of the Creation". His stories are often so vivid that he gets away with packing in quite a bit of scientific detail, painting a more accurate picture of the wonderful events he observed as he travelled around the countryside. White's book is one of the classics of nature writing, and there's even an apocryphal story online that this is one of the most printed books in the country, after the Bible and Shakespeare.

White may have been one of those people with a capacity for endless activity, or perhaps he took rather more care over natural history than his vocation. Either way, I do think that anyone - from the parish priest to the youngest member of the congregation - could learn from his appreciation of creation. It is well worth spending ten minutes every now and again staring into a bush, pond or tree - especially in winter when it's easy to hurry indoors and put the kettle on. Experiencing wildlife first-hand is wonderful fuel for our worship of God and care for His creation. As Psalm 111 says, "Great are the works of the Lord; they are pondered by all who delight in them" (NIV).


