





LETTER FROM REVD LOUISE

Dear Friends,

This letter comes with my love and prayers for the Christmas season and for all that lies ahead in the coming year.

There is something familiar and comforting about the rituals and traditions that we experience at this time of the year. How often do we say to friends and family 'We *always* do such and such for Christmas.' Doing the same thing every year gives a sense of continuity and stability in an often uncertain and troubled world. The first year living in a new house, or following a bereavement or relationship breakdown can feel so difficult, because all those comforting traditions, sights and sounds are absent.

Many of our friends and neighbours are happy to come to church at Christmas and it is one of 'those things we do every year.' It makes Christmas feel right. It gives some sense that, amidst the uncertainty and superficiality of so much in our lives, there are some things that can be relied upon. Our church buildings here in South Shoebury, one Norman (12th century) and one Victorian (19th century), stand as reminders that our faith is no new invention. Indeed, the gifts of hope, faith and security given by God in the birth of Jesus, have been offered for two thousand years.

Coming to worship God at Christmas draws us into a deep truth. Whether you always have turkey, or always go to Grandma's on Boxing Day, the real landmark, the real certainty, is that the Son of God has been born into this world. It is a wonderful comfort to sing *Away in a manger* or *O little town of Bethlehem*: it is surely a far greater comfort to know that this message is true. That God has truly come and shared our life so that we can share his. It is a great comfort that, whatever changes there have been in our personal lives in the past year, God's love and companionship remain constant and unchanging.

Unemployed? Divorced? Bereaved? III? All these bring painful changes which seem all the sharper at this time of the year. May I encourage you to allow God to become one of the unchanging parts of your life? If you come to worship every Christmas, we look forward to seeing you again this year. But how about making a new tradition to bring some stability and comfort to your life? How about worshipping God in the New Year?

How about asking God to walk with you through uncertainty and change in the months to come?

Be near me, Lord Jesus, I ask Thee to stay close by me for ever and love me, I pray.

Bless all the dear children in Thy tender care, and fit us for heaven to live with Thee there.

God bless you this Christmas and into the coming year, Louise.x

Jan 6th, 13th,20th, Feb 3rd, 10th and 17th.


There is no charge but the booklets cost about £5 each so, if possible, we appreciate a contribution for that.



Building Project in St Andrew's

It's taken three years to get this far, but we eagerly anticipate work starting in January in St Andrew's to:

- Renew the heating
- Move the font from the tower to the front of the church, the opposite side to the pulpit
- Provide the chandeliers with a pulley system to enable safe use
- Create a level floor throughout the church for better access for all
- Renovate the pews and other woodwork
- Adjust the ramp to enable easier access, especially for wheelchair users

Two aspects of the project have already been completed with the installation of a new sound system and the removal of the organ. These have both created more space within the church, as well as greatly improving the sound quality. Be assured we still have an organ and a digital piano which we use whenever we can. We don't currently have a regular organist or pianist at St Andrew's and rely on pre-recorded music.

The whole project has been made possible because of the generosity of those who left money to the church in their


Wills. We give thanks for all who give to our churches and invite you to consider remembering us in your Will.


We expect the work to take approximately 9 weeks so we will worship in the Church Hall during that time.

6th December – What's in a (Christmas) Name?

What do your family call him, that cheerful old man in a red robe and floppy hat who pops up everywhere at Christmas? Sometimes he's Father Christmas, sometimes Santa Claus, and in parts of Europe he's Saint Nicholas. That's his real name, abbreviated to 'Santa Claus' by Brits and Americans who don't like to follow the Europeans, and then turned into a more homely, cuddly kind of name for the children. Whatever he's called, his function is the same – delivering presents to children at Christmas.

The first St Nicholas was bishop of Myra, in the country we now call Turkey, in the fourth century. He was known as the friend of the poor, and especially poor or abused children. At (or just before) Christmas he went around handing out presents to them, as well as rescuing some from dreadful circumstances. The red robe our modern Santa Claus wears may be a vague representation of a bishop's garment, and the floppy hat is his mitre!

The original good bishop from 1600 years ago is remembered by the Church on December 6th, and the lucky children in Belgium and the Netherlands get their presents then.
